Questions	Bus question about friends on a bus-From Corrine Varga Transportation Director. "Currently we are looking at it on a case to case basis. We are saying no to students who are not registered on a bus and we are accepting one offs for emergencies but we are trying to stay away from birthday parties, etc. The parents have been calling our office and if accepted, we are asking them to follow up with an email from both parents (receiving and sending)." Linda Wagers mentioned that there are concerns around insurance for kids who are not normally on the bus before and after school. This is different from a field trip. Alahna wondered if it had to do with COVID and still minimizing the number of children who are riding together. Jeff/Linda to gather more information from Corrine. Bell times-concern is around bell times that are different between elementary and jr/sr high. When teachers have to move from one schedule to another there seems to sometimes be a lag when teachers are getting back to elementary classrooms. There is about a for the base of the ball times.
	about a 6 minute difference between the bell times. Because the jr/sr high kids don't get recess there is a difference in the schedule both in the morning and afternoon. Typically if a teacher has a scheduling issue then we provide EA coverage until the teacher arrives. We try not to do too much schedule cross over due to this when creating timetables.
	Alahna asked Linda Wagers who sits on the Transportation committee about bus times and how many minutes students ride on a school bus. Linda explained that the goal of transportation is to try and minimize student riding time which can be very challenging.

These include Astronomy, Military Studies, Theatre, Marine Life and Ecosystems, and more Math!</li> <li>Transportation has continued to keep replacing buses so as to keep the "age" at a reasonable state. This has been the standard practice. We currently have three buses serving the area for BGS. Budget will be monitored but fuel is always a consideration that is difficult at the best of times.</li> <li>Lots of movement in the Division wrt to administrative and teaching changes. We are excited by the upcoming year with the many new groupings and combinations that have occurred.</li> <li>Pre kindergarten/PUF (Program Unit Funding) was addressed with the Board. Asst. Superintendent, Marcie Perdue clarified how the gov't has changed funding for students and some schools will be more affected than others. The Board will be asking for more clarification from the gov't.</li> <li>CESD has established a "Flourishing Stories and Innovation" ADHOC Committee to look into what is happening in other divisions and look at possibilities in CESD</li> <li>CESD is looking into how to further provide safety and security to all students in the division wrt passwords for all grades</li> <li>BGS grade 1's should have received their tree for Arbor Day which is specifically designed to promote conservation with our students!</li> </ul>
