School Outcome and Corresponding Strategies	 100% of BGS students participating will meet the acceptable/satisfactory standard, and 25% of BGS students will achieve the standard of excellence/proficiency on grade level assessments. Grade 1-10 BGS students will write standardized assessments in writing and mathematics to determine level of ability and inform teaching practice. BGS teacher teams will analyze student data through the collaborative response model and through the BGS K-12 Vertical Team Process to put necessary interventions and strategies in place to improve academic success. BGS teachers will continue to implement Google Classrooms for all grades and in all subject areas. Technology will be embedded into instruction, assessment, and student learning. BGS teacher teams will acupate the implementation of new curriculum through collaboration and professional learning BGS teacher teams will accommodate, adapt and modify content where appropriate to ensure students can reach their highest academic potential, including implementation of life skills programming. 	 Any student challenged in an area of social emotional well-being will have access to BGS and Division supports and services. BGS Staff members will use the supportive process (KITE) for the most vulnerable students. BGS staff will use the <u>Social</u> <u>Emotional Framework</u> tool to identify student needs and plan interventions. BGS teachers will be supported by the BGS Student Services team and the Family School Wellness Worker and the Social Emotional Specialists (as required) in analyzing the data and creating intervention plans for students. BGS will pilot the Social Emotional Wellness (SEW 15) course for grade 10 students. The BGS Student Success coach (YES) will continue to provide universal and targeted programming for students. The BGS Family School Wellness worker will continue to support students. 	 60% of BGS students will transition to post-secondary within 6 years of grade 10. The BGS Career Connections Team will refine promising practices for careers planning for schools including meeting with a member of the career team in grades 10, 11 and 12 and provide opportunities for students to visit post-secondary campuses. The BGS Career Connections Team will provide students with career pathway experiences and skill development through dual credit, RAP and work experience opportunities. The BGS Careers Connection Team will ensure a clear process to connect high school students to scholarships, bursaries and other opportunities including Rutherford Eligibility. BGS Elementary students will be exposed to career pathways through guest speakers, and curricular activities to explore future careers and opportunities. BGS middle and high school staff will use MyBlueprint for career exploration beginning in grade 7.
