

Collaborative Day

Last Friday, November 25, was a collaborative day for teachers. This was an opportunity for all of our teachers to work professionally with their colleagues in our school and from other CESD schools.

Our Kinder to Grade 8 teachers worked together in their vertical team groups on our collaborative response to student social/emotional and academic challenges. We use a collaborative response approach to develop strategies and action plans for students who require a little more help in these areas.

Our high school teachers are engaged in a CESD project that brings them together with subject specific colleagues to develop shareable Google Classrooms for each of the high school courses. They are working on developing high quality instructional strategies and assessments. This multi year project will provide a great resource for our high schools. Not only is the end product important for our students, but the opportunity to develop resources alongside professional colleagues allows our teachers to improve their skills and understandings about the curriculum as well.


