



Valedictorian Address

For the first three months, I never spoke a single word, but it was Mrs. Tuff's patient nature that allowed me to slowly start to open up. I honestly felt scared. But through the years, the actions of teachers, classmates, and friends, I got cheered on until I finally found my confidence. Not all of us started here at Bowden Grandview school though, there are those who joined us after our kindergarten year at various points. For them, at whatever time they joined it was probably just as scary as starting kindergarten again. Most likely all of you probably share an experience similar to mine. So tonight, I stand before you here to celebrate how we have all discovered our voices. How we will use them to shape tomorrow.

Our journey together has been a long one. We've lost some people along the way. We've gained some new ones. But through it all, we have persevered, together. Through online classes when the covid lockdown hit in grade 7, through the assignments and exams of our grade 12 year and through the impending prophecy of our adulthood. Through all of the struggles and sacrifices, we can finally say "I have made it"... but our story is not over yet. I feel like it is just beginning, because now is the time when we decide who we truly want to be. There is a dream somewhere deep down inside all of us, but it's up to each of us to pursue it. Now is the time we choose not only our future careers, but how we show up–as leaders, as friends, and as citizens of a world in need of our voices. A world with economic uncertainty, inflation, conflicts and rising tariffs. More than ever we need to show up, we need to use our voices, we need to participate in our rapidly changing world and all that comes with it. In this school, we aren't just numbers—we are faces, each one familiar, each one important. We have built incredible relationships with each other and I am not just talking about our class of students or students in other grades, I am talking about all the teachers, administration, and even the parents and community volunteers who support us and walk our hallways daily and know who we are. As we move forward into the bigger world we will carry that sense of closeness with us. No matter how large the world becomes, we will always know what it means to be seen. And thus I would like to thank all the incredible teachers and EA's who have helped to mentor and guide us as well as encouraged us to use our voices, all the administration and support staff for everything you do behind the scenes helping make our success possible, and all the parents and community volunteers who dedicate their time for fundraising and school programs whether it be as a coach or in the breakfast program. Thank you again to everyone who has helped us through this chapter of our story.

As each of us start this next chapter our paths won't be the same, but we share a common responsibility to lift each other up, to speak loudly for those who are still finding their voices, and to build bridges where there are walls. Continue to grow, continue to question, and never stop striving for better. The only thing stopping you is you going "I'm too dumb to learn that". The truth is no you're not. You just don't know enough about it yet.





Up in the Leaves: The True Story of the Central Park Treehouses by Shira Boss


The Nice Dream Truck By Beth Ferry




