4. Phones must be left in lockers or shut off and placed at the table up front.

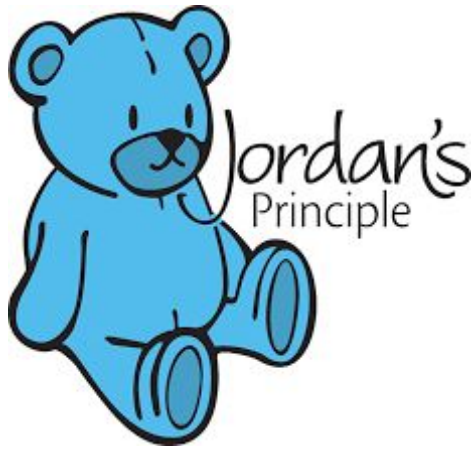

We started our day at Sunnybrook Farm, where we experienced what life was like for early pioneers. We tried our hand at making butter and bannock, and even got to milk a cow—what a fun (and messy!) way to learn!



In the afternoon, we visited the MAG (Museum and Art Gallery), where we explored Indigenous and Métis artifacts from our area. We learned so much about the rich cultures and stories of the people who lived here long before us. Inspired by the beautiful works of artist Alex Janvier, we ended our day by creating our own pieces of vibrant abstract art. What a fantastic day of learning, hands-on fun, and creativity!





Jordan's Principle is a program designed to ensure that First Nations, Metis, Inuit children receive timely access to the services and support they need. This year we had the opportunity to have teachings within our school once a week where Clare Butterfly and Dakota came to meet with two groups of students. **Clare** and **Dakota**, passionate Indigenous educators dedicated to sharing cultural teachings and traditions with youth, worked on various activities throughout the year including beading and creating medicine bags and various carvings.

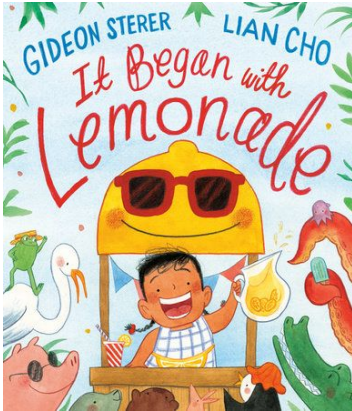

It Began with Lemonade

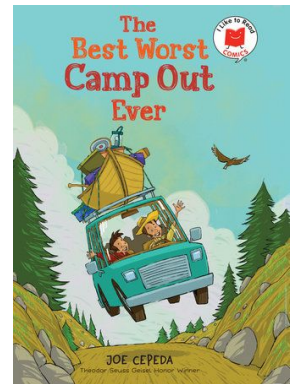

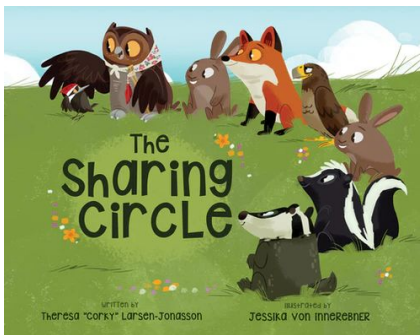
